School Uniform Policy

Our policy is based on the view that a school uniform:

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- Promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- Engenders a feeling of community and belonging;
- Is practical and smart;
- Identifies the students with their school;
- Makes students feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- Is regarded as suitable by most parents;
- Has been designed with the health and safety of the students in mind;
- Adheres to strict ADEK and government regulations.

School Bags

Please note that as per the ADEK policy, wheely bags are not allowed. Students should bring a rucksack with two shoulder straps, Noya British school bags are encouraged, but optional. It is recommended that a child's school bag does not exceed 20% of their body weight to avoid adverse effects on their spine and body.

School Shoes

Smart, black shoes or trainers (no logos, no colours) with white socks must be worn. Please note that boots, sandals, and crocs are not permitted. White trainers are required for PE lessons.



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School Uniform Policy

Hair

Hair should be neat and tidy, with no extreme hair colouring or styles. Hair below collar length should be tied back or plaited. Only plain practical accessories may be worn in the school colours.

Jewellery

Students are permitted to wear a watch (not a SMART watch). Stud earrings maybe worn. No other jewellery is permitted. In line with safe practices, earrings must be removed for PE and swimming lessons.

Cultural Sensitivity

It is recognised that some parents of young girls would prefer that their arms and legs are fully covered. In such circumstances, second skins/int-shirts (obtainable through major retailers such as Lulu, Max, Splash, Sun and Sands) and leggings may be worn underneath uniforms, or trousers may by worn (obtainable tailormade, from the uniform supplier).

Frequently asked questions

1) Is the Aldar Education Digital Safety Package mandatory for all devices?

All devices brought into our school by students will need a digital safety package. To ensure the safety of all our stakeholders, no devices will be allowed into our schools without this package.

2) If I purchase the devices from the e-store, do I still need to pay the Aldar Education Digital Safety Package fee? Our store's recommended device bundles will include our digital safety package. If a parent has bought a device from another outlet or owns one that meets our minimum expectations, they can buy the digital safety package separately in our E-Store.

3) If we bring our own devices, how can we ensure that the devices we purchase meet the school's specifications and requirements?

Our parents can buy carefully crafted technology bundles on our e-store. If their children already own existing Apple technologies, the following requirements and specifications will be in line with the new strategy:

- Minimum iPad 8th Generation, iPad Air 4th Generation 64GB
- Keyboard Case
- Stylus
